Helping Out in Haiti

Sunrise Methodist Church in Colorado Springs is doing a service project in Haiti March 18-26. They will be returning to God's Littlest Angels Orphanage to do some construction. Four more people are needed ASAP for the trip which will cost \$1950. Medical training and speaking French are a plus but not needed as the focus is construction. Guatemala Medical & Construction Trip (Nov. 19-28, 2010)

Our week in San Juan la Laguna went quickly. Medical clinics were held three days in San Juan and 2 days in San Pablo with 158 patients seen by one doctor, one RN, one PT. The new dental clinic is almost finished and ready to start seeing patients with all new equipment. The cost of this equipment was \$20,000 with a need of \$6,500 to pay off this debt; ODIM

is working hard to raise the necessary funds to complete the project.

Many of the patients remembered the returning team members and greeted us with enthusiasm. One patient who had suffered for weeks with a respiratory infection was diagnosed with advanced pneumonia. Although he had been to another doctor and hospital prior to coming to the San Juanerita Clinic, he couldn't afford the medicines earlier prescribed. Medicines are free at the San Juanerita Clinic; and it is not uncommon for patients to not afford the medicines prescribed at other medical facilities. He was grateful for our care.

The elderly patients took the time to methodically thank each team member for coming to help and for our prayers on their behalf.

Our construction component was 2 persons, with one being a high school student. Their work was non-stop in building shelves and a desk in the examination room. Each trip shows wonderful progress in storage for the clinic.

A heart felt Thank You to each of our team for their time and dedication.

2. **"TAPS Valentines Event"** will be held in Dillon for the widows of 10 soldiers killed in action during 2010. Accommodation has been donated by the community, as have massages, aromatherapy and reflexology treatments. Volunteers have been found to accompany the ladies on a walking tour in Breckenridge, a woman has been asked to provide spiritual context, and a psychiatrist has been employed. All meals will be provided, but FOB SCO needs money to pay for it!

CASA Volunteer Training Schedule 2010-2011

CASA of the Continental Divide offers four volunteer advocate trainings a year. Two trainings are Independent Study. The Independent Study training consists of two group trainings, one full day and one half day training, over a period of approximately four weeks. The prospective volunteer is responsible for reading the manual, completing the assigned homework assignments and participating in a courtroom observation. The other curriculum consists of six group meetings, over a period of two weeks. The prospective volunteers will participate in discussions facilitated by community professionals, as it relates to the training manual, including participating in a courtroom observation.
